Taking Another Look: WHY?

Why did the enemies of Jesus want the death penalty for him? Why could he not just have been imprisoned, or banished? They saw that people were following Jesus in increasing numbers, that he had the ability to release them from their fears, to bring joy & health back into their lives. Most worryingly of all, he spoke with authority about the scriptures and the Law: "You have heard it said but now I say to you . . ."! His very assurance and certainty unnerved them. They feared for the loss of their own authority and power. He had to go; but on what concrete evidence? They needed more than their own wounded egos with which to charge him.

Jesus neither claimed to be the Messiah nor denied it. He did link himself with The Son of Man, the one who, in the Book of Daniel, lived in the realm of the divine, but none of this was enough to bring to court.

To get the death penalty, the Jews needed the Romans, but they were not interested in religious controversy, only in maintaining peace on the streets and loyalty to Caesar. The day Jesus stormed into the Temple, that most holy of places and scattered the traders with his whip, the Jews knew they had what they needed. Jesus was disturbing the peace and threatening the stability of the city. Moreover it was rumoured that he had spoken of his Kingdom, so he must be challenging Caesar.

They hoped this flimsy evidence might be enough. The 'sin of the world' was pressing in on Jesus and his fear grew. Others had suffered crucifixion and this could well be his sentence.

We know this was indeed his sentence and that in his terror Jesus pleaded with his Father for an alternative way, but trust in his Father prevailed and he fulfilled his mission of love.

When we look at Jesus on the Cross, (his supreme act of love for us), we are also seeing a victory for sin, a temporary victory, for hidden within this mystery is the permanent Victory over Sin itself, the Resurrection, when the once historical Jesus of Nazareth, rose triumphant as the Christ, the Cosmic Christ.

The life of Jesus is not just a holy story from the past. We are called to live this Victory today especially where the same prejudice, egoism and misuse of power are evident, because Evil, though ultimately defeated, is still around. Where today? What actions and risks is Christ asking from us today?
